Senior Firefighter – Casual

Kananaskis Emergency Services is seeking highly motivated and enthusiastic team players to fulfil the role of Driver/Operator within the organization. Reporting to the Station Officer, the Senior Firefighter is responsible on an as-needed basis for all fire and rescue operations and operational assignments as provided from the Kananaskis Emergency Services Centre. This will include emergency and non-emergency operations as related to fire suppression, vehicle rescue, medical first response, structural rescue, hazardous material interventions, wildland urban interface, wildland fire suppression, helicopter operations and assisting with backcountry/slope rescue. As well as routine equipment maintenance, station duties, training and public engagement activities.

Shifts are 24 hours in duration and include 14 core hours (0700-2100) and 10 on-call hours (2100-0700). Senior Firefighters are required to provide a minimum of 4 shifts of availability per month and work a minimum of 2 shifts per month. Accommodations during on-call hours are provided for those that do not reside within the response radius..

Minimum Qualifications:

- High School Diploma
- Accredited NFPA 1001 Level 2
- Accredited NFPA 1002 Driver and Pump Operator
- ICS100 minimum
- Valid Class 3 (or higher) Alberta Operator's License with air brake endorsement, less than 6 demerits
- Standard First Aid, CPR-BLS/HCP or higher.
- Two (2) years of experience with a municipal fire department

Preference will be given to applicants that have completed NFPA 1002 Aerial Operator, NFPA 1051 Wildland Firefighter, Advanced First Aid/Emergency Medical Responder training or higher, and have a demonstrated knowledge of the Kananaskis Improvement District.

Starting Wage: \$22.00/hr (core) plus \$5.00/hr (on-call). Responses during on-call hours will be paid at core rate.

Other Benefits: Additional training/course opportunities (ICS, 1002 Aerial, 1006 Rescue Awareness/Slope Rescue, 1041 Level I Instructor, 1021 Level I Officer, Wildland Urban Interface Crew Member, etc.). Instructional opportunities. Live fire training. Career development opportunities.

Note: This position is with the Kananaskis Improvement District and is not part of the Government of Alberta or Alberta Union of Provincial Employees.
